Shelter on Linde Reserve – President Jim Owler

A kick off meeting has been held with representatives of Traegermunt Builders, Norwood St Peters Payneham Council, TPC and Rotary members Jim Owler, Phil Smith & David Heilbronn. The council are arranging for a notification sign to be erected to inform the public of the construction works. During this meeting there was a discussion about the site layout which has now been submitted to council, irrigation plans and site safety.

Construction work is scheduled to commence on 6th November 2023 and be completed by Late November. These dates tie in with the scheduled delivery date of the shelter from Queensland. During this time there will be considerable disruption to the shed and in particular the shed café operations. Temporary notification signs require to be displayed apologising to our customers for the disruption and to advise our customers about what is happening.

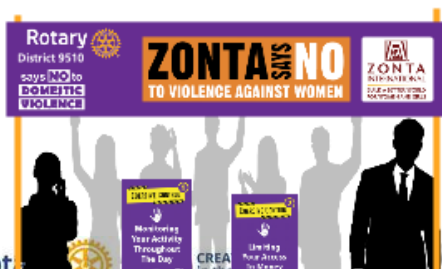
