News from our sponsored student Hilda.

Dear Arthur and all at the Rotary Club of St Peters, Greetings from The School of St Jude, I hope this email finds you well.

Hilda has returned from National Service and has started her Beyond St Jude's Community Service Year (CSY)! Hilda is currently teaching Bookkeeping and commerce at Naura Secondary School.

Since graduating from Form 6 in May, Hilda and 135 of her peers have been engaged in National Service for 3 months, as mandated by the Tanzanian government.

Similar to our CSY program, National Service aims to instill a sense of national pride and passion in young Tanzanian citizens to contribute effectively to the country. St Jude's graduates who participated in National Service have returned with a renewed enthusiasm for involvement and helping their communities flourish! We are very proud of these graduates, who have shared stories of hard work and challenges; however, like conquering Mount Kilimanjaro, the view was worth the climb and the end result rewarding.

Over the last two weeks, our new CSY volunteers returned to St Jude's to participate in the Work Readiness Training—a ten-day course to help them prepare for their community service placements in government schools and St Jude's departments. This week, all the volunteers have reported to their volunteer placements. During Work Readiness Training, CSY volunteers learned a multitude of things, including:

- Life skills how to manage their time, establish professional relationships with colleagues, and personal budgeting.
- Learning about the concept of 'Competence Building' specifically for those going to teach in government schools.
- Conflict resolution lessons on what conflict is, causes, types, and steps of resolving and preventing conflict.
- Teaching methods including the effective use of textbooks and teaching aids for teaching and learning.

CSY volunteers were given materials, including lesson plan books, stationery and textbooks that will help them as they commence their placements.

Combining knowledge attained through St Jude's education, skills from National Service and mentorship from the BSJ team, we are sure that Hilda will be able to face new challenges with confidence and optimism.

Attached to this email is a letter and a photo of Hilda, eager to start her placement. I hope that you still recognize her out of uniform!

Arthur and all at the Rotary Club of St Peters, thank you for being our champions in supporting St Jude's vision and mission and fighting poverty through education. All this is possible because of you.

End Polio Now News

To celebrate the End Polio Now campaign the Rotary Club of St Peters will be sharing information with everyone at the Shed this Saturday, 28 October.

"Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u>, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease.

Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free.

If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year." *From the website Rotary.org*
