Guest Speakers

Romaine Dawson introduced guest speaker Sasha Ritson who passionately explained what Lion Hearts Learning is doing for children undergoing cancer treatment.

She started the group in 2017 when her niece was diagnosed with cancer.



Lion Hearts Learning is a South Australian registered children's charity that provides a free playgroup and pre-school service to children impacted by cancer. Children undergoing oncology have severely compromised immune systems and need to be kept isolated. Lion Hearts Learning ensures the environment is clean and hygienic.

Lion Hearts Learning provides social, emotional and educational type learning. The aim is to ensure children have the opportunity to gain independence and make decisions on their own, to build confidence and self-esteem, to make friends of their own, and to learn to be ready for schooling.

During Covid-19 the group communicated via Zoom and this turned out to be an advantage because it gave the children new skills.



The group has set up a house in Aberfoyle Park for respite use by the children and their families. When asked about the name, Sasha explained that children undergoing treatment for cancer have 'Lion hearts'.

Sasha introduced Jeremy Traeger who was one of a group who cycled from Adelaide to Melbourne via the Great Ocean Road to raise funds for Lion Hearts Learning.

Dennis Henschke thanked Sasha and Jeremy for their presentations, and Romaine Dawson handed Sasha a cheque from the club. The group doesn't receive Government funding.

Honorary Membership

<u>President Jim presented Jenny Neale with an Honorary Membership of the Rotary Club of St Peters.</u>

The Rotary Club of St Peters has been a sponsor of the AllKids program – bringing education, nutrition and dental hygiene to children in the Reim Commune Cambodia.

July 2021 the RC St Peters partnered with AllKids, Jenny, (partner of PDG Jeff Neale) and Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) to raise funds to build an Early learning Centre at Prek Trabaek bringing education, health and nutrition to children in extremely poor circumstances, who would otherwise be without access to education.

Jenny Neale as Patron of the project took the message to 87 Rotary Clubs across SA, Alice Springs, Broken Hill and Sunraysia and to delegates attending the district 9510 Barossa Conference. The goal was to raise \$23K to build the centre on land donated by a Cambodian resident.

By June December 2022 Jenny had eclipsed all expectations with Clubs and individual Rotarians contributing \$48,000 to the project.

At our core, Rotary is a common ground for people to come together – across nationalities and religions, cultures, and histories – to connect around our shared belief in a better tomorrow. That connection is what humanizes us in times of conflict and builds a foundation for lasting peace. Rotary remains committed to working with our members, partners, and communities to find long-term, sustainable solutions that support peace and development in the Middle East and everywhere.

We believe clubs and districts around the world can help. In that spirit, there are specific steps you can take to help those affected by the violence in these difficult times.

There are Rotary and Rotaract clubs throughout the Middle East. We urge Rotary members who want to help to connect directly with the districts and these clubs in the region to determine the most relevant avenues of support.





Additionally, we encourage members to take action through the following Rotary programs:

Using district grants (from districts in the region and elsewhere) to carry out projects that support displaced persons and provide medical and other needed humanitarian assistance.

Developing meaningful, longer-term projects with international partners that align with Rotary's areas of focus and are eligible to receive funding as global grants.

Members can make long-term investments in peacebuilding through Rotary by:

- Contributing District Designated Funds or district cash to support Rotary's Peace Centres, which invest in peacebuilders around the world, or the peacebuilding and conflict prevention area of focus that supports programs like our Positive Peace Activator Program.
- Joining Rotary peace programs that advance global understanding and peacebuilding, including Rotary Action Groups, Rotary Friendship Exchanges, Intercountry Committees, and Rotary Fellowships.

Together, let's be the inspiration to create hope in the world.
