## Taking Control of your Estate – Catherine Follett

Catherine started her career as a Judge's Associate to the Honourable Justice Nyland in the Supreme Court, then worked for a number of years in criminal law.

After then spending almost a decade in Laos, Catherine is now the owner and director of MSM Legal, a specialist migration and wills and estates law firm based in Wright Street Adelaide.

Catherine spends most of her time focusing on refugee claims, Tribunal appeals, and wills and estates.

Overall, Catherine thinks her 28 years of being a lawyer comes down to nagging clients to do what she tells them to do.

### Catherine outlined a preferable way one can take control of one's assets.

Attendees were given an outline of items that may need attention.

- e.g. List all of your family members (past and present) with contact details
- List your assets
- What you owe
- The whereabouts of your will
- Choosing an Executor (under 65)
- Names and Details of Accountant, Financial Adviser etc

Pay attention to your Electronic Assets

- Record your passwords (Apple ID, email etc)
- Be sure they can be located

Make sure of an

- Advanced Care Directive
- Power of Attorney
- A current Will

### Jack's Farm visit

Several St Peters Rotarians, their partners and friends travelled to Jack's Farm on the weekend from 10<sup>th</sup> to the 12<sup>th</sup> November.

We met with Rotarians and partners from the Rotary Club of Peterborough. The club applied for a St Peters club Environmental Grant and we were able to meet with Allan and Colleen Grove-Jones to inspect the site and obtain details of the project which is located at the Peterborough Youth and Community Centre.

Their club is doing an excellent job in assisting the youth of the town with driver training and an introduction to self-sufficiency gardening.



They have built a shed to house a vehicle and equipment for youth driver training and they plan to purchase a rainwater tank to catch water from the shed roof to be used by the young people to grow vegetables by wicking methodology.

We enjoyed a fellowship meal with members of their club on Friday night and all present were keen that our two clubs should maintain a liaison with each other.

On Saturday the group carried out some maintenance of the trees planted on Jack's farm by St Peters Rotarians in 2018.

On the Sunday, Peterborough Rotarians led by Allan Grove-Jones took us for an interesting tag-a-long tour of the station country east of Terowie and Hallett. We saw aboriginal rock carvings, abandoned station buildings and water tanks and the restored cottage where Sir Hubert Wilkins grew up.
