Blokes' Kitchen 6th session 'Let's do Brunch'

'Let's do Brunch' included the preparation of a highly nutritious whole grains and dried fruit muesli, French toast with fresh fruit, a ham and cheese savoury omelette with fried tomato, and a white bean and sun-dried tomato salad.

Following an introduction outlining some Brunch options and the nutritive values of our menu items, along with the skills involved, groups of three worked together preparing the muesli and the salad. During this, many laughs and much joshing led to final decisions on job demarcation and cooperation. Then, when that was complete, each of us made our own French toast and omelette.

The Blokes' Kitchen has always had two aims –

1. Preparing food by following recipes (with a note that the basic can always be modified to suit the individual), and learning and practising fundamental cooking skills
2. Working together in a fun and friendly atmosphere

In this session knife skills were again to the fore, and shallow fat frying, and the care and use of a fry pan, was introduced. Participants also used portable induction cook plates, and these proved a great hit. For this writer, omelette preparation has always had a mystique associated with it, and the surprising thing is that it wasn't too difficult to produce a reasonable, very tasty looking, one.

The second aim is also being fully met. The Blokes are now very comfortable with each other to the point that even gentle insults relating a spelling error in the recipe list, and to lack of skill with the preparation and cooking, are easily thrown about!



Impressively, the kitchen is spotless before anyone leaves. This is very pleasing, and very different from working with the teenage boys previously experienced by our leader.

- The A380 Airbus is made in France
- Churches are maintained by the government
- Hop On Hop Off Tours of cities are a great introduction
