#### Rotary Club of St Peters - Blokes' Kitchen

A motivated group of eight mature blokes from the local community have met monthly since August 2023 in a year-long Club pilot project developed for participants to learn some of the finer points of meal making, and to enjoy a fun time together.

The support of Norwood Payneham & St Peters Council has been essential to the success of this project by its provision of the free use of a small commercial kitchen, storage facilities, and an adjoining room for dining, which has enabled us to prepare and eat a meal at each session. Our equipment has mostly been acquired from our recycled goods Shed which operates on Saturday mornings 8.30am/12.30 pm as our Club's major fundraising activity, and as a meeting hub for locals.



The cooking sessions have a \$15 fee which covers the food and recipe printing costs. So far food prepping has included equipment skills, recipe use, time management, using the oven and induction hob, food safety and good shopping practices.

Each session has involved the preparation of a full, nutritionally sound meal, and included a very successful one dish dinner, breakfast omelettes, interesting salads, and fettuccine marinara.

Following a small cost at start-up, the project has been self-funded. With the help of suitably qualified volunteers, and the generosity of our local council, it has been a challenging, but highly recommended, community support project. With the program's success, the Club is aiming to continue into next Rotary year.

Help Rotary recruit peace and development leaders

Applications for the 2025 Rotary Peace Fellowships are open until 15 May.

Dear club presidents and district officers,

You can help promote peace in the world by encouraging peace and development leaders in your community to apply for the Rotary Peace Fellowship.

Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for peacebuilders from diverse backgrounds to study at one of our peace centers located at leading universities around the world. This year, we'll select 50 peace fellows to study in our <u>master's degree programs</u> at six partner universities in Asia, Australia, Europe, and the United States and 80 fellows to earn postgraduate diplomas through our <u>professional development certificate programs</u> at Makerere University in Uganda and Bahçeşehir University in Turkey.

Rotary Peace Fellows use their training to amplify their work at the local, regional, or global level. Together, we can advance peace by encouraging our local peacebuilders to learn about Rotary and apply for this unique fellowship.

But we need your help finding candidates. Rotary and Rotaract members can get involved by:

- Visiting the <u>Rotary Peace Centers Facebook page</u> for application graphics and posts to share
- Forwarding the <u>fellowship announcement</u> to your contacts and including it in club and district communications
- Using our referral form so potential candidates can receive more information and apply
- Sharing a <u>PowerPoint presentation</u> about the fellowships with your club members and community
- Taking the <u>All About Rotary Peace Fellowships course</u> to learn about the centers and fellowship qualification criteria, eligibility restrictions, and application process

Candidates have until 15 May to submit applications to The Rotary Foundation.

Thanks to generous support from donors and the dedicated participation of Rotary members, the peace fellowship program has more than 1,700 alumni working to make positive change in more than 140 countries. Many program alumni have founded their own organizations to address critical issues or serve as leaders in governments, nongovernmental organizations, educational and research institutions, media and the arts, and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank.
