From Treasure Boxes "After last Saturday morning we would like to send this list of items Trish can collect for Treasure Boxes. We don't have the capacity in the car to take large items.


The bag we received which contained baby blankets was perfect.

Blokes' Kitchen

In the eighth session the Blokes prepared an easy green chicken curry with flat bread and rice, and a tasty side dish was demonstrated.







Now that the blokes are more experienced, while following the same basic curry recipe they had the option of making additions to the recipe if they wished, such as extra vegetables or garlic.

Again, with the flatbread, some chose to add mixed herbs or oregano. Again, garlic was a favourite seasoning.

Making the flatbread was particularly enjoyable (and messy) as we mixed, kneaded, cut the dough into 8, and rolled back and forth until very thin discs of dough developed.

It was lovely to see it rising and browning in the frypan.

When we sat down to eat, the meal was very tasty, and this writer particularly enjoyed dipping the bread in the curry sauce – yum!

We discussed dishes we might learn to make for the final sessions of this learning to cook course. Some possible options included pancakes and even how to make a quiche.
