The Rotary Foundation

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris.

Over time, Rotary’s reach and vision gradually extended to humanitarian service. We have a long track record of addressing challenges in communities and around the world.

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary president Arch Klumph proposed setting up an endowment “for the purpose of doing good in the world.” That one idea, and an initial contribution of \$26.50, set in motion a powerful force that has transformed millions of lives around the globe.

Our Foundation was founded more than 100 years ago and has spent more than \$4 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects.

Its mission is to help Rotary members to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment, and alleviating poverty.

End Polio

We began our fight against polio in 1979 with a project to immunize 6 million children in the Philippines. Today, polio remains endemic in only two countries — down from 125 in 1988.

So far this year, there have been 25 cases of WPV. This compares **with 173 cases in 2019, 33 cases in 2018, 22 cases in 2017, 37 cases in 2016, 74 cases in 2015 and 356 in 2014.**

THE ERADICATION OF POLIO WILL REMAIN AS ROTARY’S SIGNATURE PROJECT AND THE FOREMOST PROGRAM OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION UNTIL THE JOB IS DONE

Our greatest internal priority is membership.

Our greatest external priority is the elimination of polio from the planet.

And these two are interlinked through the Rotary Foundation.... We have the highest rating by Charity Navigator with four stars. Now this isn’t a once off, this is the fourteenth consecutive year.

We know that people join Rotary to make a difference. And this difference is in our communities, in ourselves.

We also know that the Foundation is a key way that we are to make this difference, through funding projects, or through facilitating experiences. Please see the website for details on District and Global grants.

Membership, Public Image, and The Rotary Foundation rely innately on each other.



The Centurion program provides an opportunity to donate \$100 a year to the Rotary Foundation and be recognised for it.

This is similar for the donation of \$1000 US for a Paul Harris Fellow, and more to be recognised as a major donor. Also \$10,000 bequests are an option.

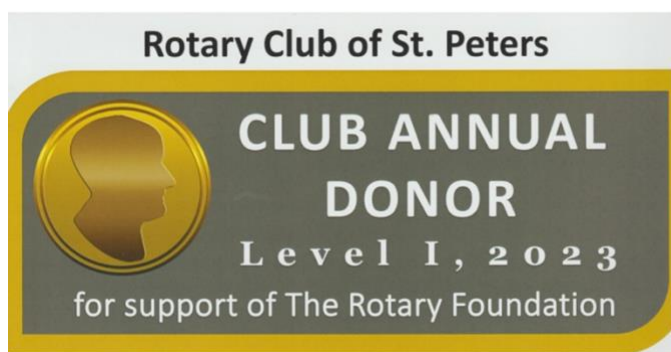
Jerry Casburn – A/District Foundation Chair
