Guest Speaker



Tim Mee was introduced by Wendy Gaborit. Tim is the District 9510 International Chair.

Tim showed slides and spoke about the **New Dawn – Rotary Ukraine Crisis Aid Project**.

Project Mission - 'To provide direct humanitarian aid to Ukrainians in Odesa and regional villages. Working in association with Ukrainian not-for-profit charitable NGO "New Dawn" and Rotary District 2232 (Odesa, Ukraine)'

New Dawn was started by Julia, a Ukrainian from Odesa following the invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. Her request for volunteers and a place to co-ordinate support for people impacted by the conflict was answered by locals. Initially based in School 35, in August 2022 they relocated to derelict premises which were made fit for purpose by volunteers.

New Dawn received NGO status in June 2022 and this completed the transformation from a grass-roots volunteer movement to an efficient and structured organisation. At the heart of the work is distribution of 100 food aid packs a day to Internally Displace People (IDPs) in Odesa. Additional funding and volunteer capacity is used to deliver humanitarian aid packs to regional towns and villages in southern Ukraine. Outreach visits three times per week to the "forgotten villages" east of Odesa.

These villages receive no support from any other aid organisations and have limited fresh water and electricity supply. New Dawn receives financial support from two German NGO groups. These organisations fund the food packs.

The Ukraine Crisis Project has developed through Rotarians networking and working together. This project provides the opportunity for Rotarians in District 9510 to directly improve the lives of Ukrainians impacted by the conflict who are not receiving support from other aid organisations.

This is not a donate and forget project. We have partners in Ukraine and are seeing the tangible benefits of our donations. Help us to do good in our world.

Bloke's Kitchen

Session 9 of the Blokes' Kitchen was aimed at the preparation of *Easy Meals for Family and Friends*. During the session, Blokes prepared a Chicken Hokkien Noodle Stir-fry and a Pizza.









The recipe for preparation of the stir-fry was quite complex with many different vegetables being used (broccoli, bok choy, red and green pepper, spring onions, snow peas) all of which had to be prepared, and some cooked separately as they required more time. Similarly, the chicken had to be de-fatted (is there such a word?) and cut into smaller chunks.



Making our own base for the pizza provided a different challenge with the fun of mixing, kneading, and rolling out into a thin (almost) circle. Toppings of pasta sauce, tomato, sliced meat, and mozzarella cheese were added.

After cooking, we sat down to eat and found we had made enough for both a good meal and for leftovers, which were taken home.

The final session of this pilot project will be held in May and, by popular demand, we shall be making a quiche and strawberry pancakes. Yes, these real men do eat quiche!



Future sessions of these Blokes' Kitchen, which were developed to assist older men interested in learning some basic cooking skills, and in having fun and fellowship with other blokes at the same time, are under consideration.

Due to the generosity of the NPSP Council, which provided a kitchen at no charge, each session, at which blokes have made and eaten a meal, have been at a cost of \$15 which covered food purchases.
