Name behind the badge by Julia Verran -

I migrated to Australia in 1966 with my mother and father and brother from England. We arrived in Essendon airport, then went to the hostels in Melbourne and so the next 10 years was schooling and moving around a bit.

I lived in Hobart for a while at a little place called Snug which was really nice. It's right on the beach and it has all the wooded tiers behind so that was nice. I worked in a toy shop, then we moved back to Melbourne and I worked in a pharmacy for a while and also a shoe shop.



Then I moved back to Hobart and finally after a couple of years came to Adelaide and that was in 1977. I did various jobs over the time and because I hadn't had a lot of education I went back and did mature matriculation for Year 12 which was good.

I had two children, a boy and a girl in that time and I also did Tupperware of which I was a manager which was good retail education. I started to work for Toucan Pet Centre in 1985 and met Kevin Verran who had started the Toucan Pet Centres back in 1973.

At that stage he had about seven stores, so over the next a few years I got to know Kevin really well and we worked well together. I managed the day to day running of the retail stores and he kept the stores stocked from our warehouse.

As the retail scene changed over the next few years we sold and closed down quite a few of the shops and ended up with our flagship shop left which was in Rundle Mall in the basement of Harris Scarfes .

I married Kevin in 2004 and worked in our city store, which was now on the second level in the Myer Centre until I retired in 2022.







AWARDEE SPONSORSHIP COST: \$1,150 (2nd Club sponsored applicant \$1,100). As you are aware costs increases have had an impact everywhere including many programs. RYLA has kept our cost down for several years, but for 2024 realised we had no choice but to review this.

APPLICANT AGE RANGE: 19 - 26 years

This change to a promoted age range of 19 - 26 year olds, will however have some flexibility at the discretion of the RYLA Committee. The committee feels most applicants would benefit from having completed Year 12 and had a bit more life experience.

APPLICANT DEPOSIT: \$50 Optional Committee agreed that clubs can collect an \$50 refundable deposit from applicants. This is optional on the club's behalf and would be held by the club and refunded on delivery of their applicant's club presentation.
