Program – Special Meeting

President Elect Wendy Gaborit chaired the deliberation of the proposed amendments to the Club Policy that had been circulated to members.

There were 21 members present. With the required quorum being at least one third of club members it meant that any resolutions to change the Club Policy would be valid.



A lengthy and robust discussion took place with many members expressing their opinions.

The motions as circulated were not of universal acceptance so a series of amendments were put forward.

The amendments to the Club Policy that were passed as motions by at least the required two thirds majority of members present were –

- 1 'The national anthem be played at Special Club meetings and be adopted into the Policy documents of the Rotary Club of St Peters'.
- 2 'Special Meetings be defined in Policy as Changeover; Music Awards, Design & Creativity awards and any other event deemed special by the Board'.

A community kitchen built by the Rotary Club of Nuevo Santander at a local school is ensuring hundreds of children have meals in low-income neighbourhoods of Nuevo Laredo, a city on the U.S. border. "Most of the houses in this area do not have running water or electricity," says Club President Jorge Tello.

The club launched the \$150,000 project in 2018, and the kitchen at the Comedor Santa María school began operating in August 2020; meals were first served to-go due to the COVID-19 pandemic before the dining room opened in May 2021. "Operation costs for providing breakfast and lunch for 230 children every day is \$9,300 a month," Tello says.



The funds are donated by businesses and individuals. Club members supervise the operation, and Rotarians are providing solar panels to the facility.



RYLA

This year the RYLA program will run from 21st - 27th September 2024, again at Nunyara Conference Centre.

AWARDEE SPONSORSHIP COST: \$1,150 (2nd Club sponsored applicant \$1,100). As you are aware costs increases have had an impact everywhere including many programs. RYLA has kept our cost down for several years, but for 2024 realised we had no choice but to review this.

APPLICANT AGE RANGE: 19 - 26 years

This change to a promoted age range of 19 - 26 year olds, will however have some flexibility at the discretion of the RYLA Committee. The committee feels most applicants would benefit from having completed Year 12 and had a bit more life experience.

APPLICANT DEPOSIT: \$50 Optional

Committee agreed that clubs can collect an \$50 refundable deposit from applicants. This is optional on the club's behalf and would be held by the club and refunded on delivery of their applicant's club presentation.
