## End of Year Report – President Jim Owler

- **General.**

Since I was inducted as President of the Rotary Club of St Peters in June last year I have been honoured to have had 3 very competent Lieutenants in Wendy Gaborit, Pam Vaughton & Brian Kretchmer to help me and guide me in my year as President.

I must also acknowledge with grateful thanks to all the other board members who have assisted me.

John Reynolds, John Dubberley, David Birkedale, Chris Dawson, Phil Smith & Keith Payne.

A very special mention to John Reynolds who after many years as treasurer has decided to step down from this position. John, very well done, you have served the club very admirably and I might say with a very cheery disposition at all times.

At my inauguration I stated that my main focus would be on the Rotary Club of St Peters and I have stuck with that strategy throughout the year. The reason for this is that I would much rather do my best for the club rather than spread myself too thinly over other areas of Rotary.



- **Club Achievements in Past year.**

It is very pleasing that all of our club committee chairs have worked very hard and disbursed their budgets very wisely and summarised as follows:

*International Committee:* Donated \$11,100.00 to 5 international charitable organisations.

*Community Committee:* Donated \$28,500 to 9 local charitable organisations

*Vocational & Youth Committee:* National Youth Science Forum, Rural Medical Scholarship, Youth Sailing – One & All, Vocational Music Night, Design & Creativity Awards. Total Donated \$14,300.

*Environmental Committee:* Donated \$5,000 to 2 local charitable organisations.

*Presidents Allowance:* Donated \$3,100 to 1 x international and 1 local charitable organisation.

*Special Donation:* Following an appeal from our international President, Gordon McNally an amount A\$5,000 was approved by a show of hands for the Brazil Flood Appeal.

The total the club has donated during the past 12 months is \$52,700.

*Fund Raising Committee:* There has been an exceptional consistent increase in shed sales over the past year with sales revenue up on previous years. Without the shed and our hard working team of volunteers who put in approximately 144 volunteer hours each week at the shed none of the above programmes would be possible.

When I hand over the reins of the club to Wendy on Sunday, by reference to our balance sheet at the end of May she will have a healthy bank balance to start her year.

## President's Report (cont.)

- **Other Club Achievements.**

**Construction of Shelter:** One of the major achievements for the year was the successful construction of the shelter at the shed. Sales in our café have also risen since the shelter was constructed which has resulted in the café and counter sales rising consistently.

*Blokes Kitchen:* Over the past 12 months under the guidance and leadership of Romaine Dawson she has very successfully ran a monthly pilot programme of a group of guys learning to cook. Romaine's expertise in the hospitality industry has certainly shone through.

*Social:* A number of social occasions were organised during the year including the following; Rotary Club of St Peters Christmas meeting / party on the 9<sup>th</sup> December 2023. Over 50 Rotarians and their partners enjoyed a lovely meal and entertainment. It was lovely to see the entertainment by singer Jude Toy inspired some members to get up and have a dance.

On Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> February the club decamped to the south coast around 22 Rotarians and partners were invited by the Rotary Club of Goolwa to attend their meeting and we thank the Goolwa club for hosting us for another enjoyable evening. As many of our members stayed in the area on Tuesday night I hosted a lunch for all in my son's beach house.

At my induction last year you may recall that one of my goals was to have everybody in the club speaking with a fine Scottish accent by the end of my Presidency. In order to test all members I decided to hold a social meeting with a Scottish theme. The dress code for this was "A Touch of Tartan" and I must say Rotarians and their partners got into the spirit of things with some very original Scottish attire.

Entertainment was provided by Alan Nisbet an accomplished accordion player and tenor. Between songs by Alan Scottish jokes were recited which added to the fun of the evening. Sergeant Greg MacRogers tested many members on speaking with a fine Scottish accent although this was a spectacular failure to the treasurer's delight the club coffers ballooned with the hefty fines for failing the tests.

All in all this was a very enjoyable and light hearted evening.
