End of Year Report Summary – President Jim Owler

It is very pleasing that all of our club committee chairs have worked very hard and disbursed their budgets very wisely and summarised as follows:

International Committee: Donated \$11,100.00 to 5 international charitable organisations.

Community Committee: Donated \$28,500 to 9 local charitable

organisations

Vocational & Youth Committee: National Youth Science Forum, Rural Medical Scholarship, Youth Sailing – One & All, Vocational Music Night, Design & Creativity Awards. Total Donated \$14,300.

Environmental Committee: Donated \$5,000 to 5 local charitable organisations. Presidents Allowance: Donated \$3,100 to 1 x international and 1 local charitable organisation.

Special Donation: Following an appeal from our international President, Gordon McInally an amount A\$5,000 was approved by a show of hands for the Brazil Flood Appeal. The total the club has donated during the past 12 months is \$52,700.

Gordon Miller



In 2005 Gordon developed Cardiomyopathy as a result of a viral infection. In 2010 he suffered a cardiac arrest. Luckily Medical Aid and an AED were close by and he received prompt treatment.

Various medical procedures followed but Gordon's health deteriorated. 30 individual doctor appointments followed as he was placed on the heart transplant list in 2016. During the next 19 months and 10 days Gordon was unable to work and became very ill.

The next three months after his heart transplant were very challenging. Gordon had to stay in Sydney and have a myriad of medical procedures including very unpleasant heart biopsies that left him bruised and sore. However, he followed medical, diet and fitness recommendations and gradually returned to good health.

Lyall Pearce - Gordon Miller's friend through Heart Transplant Rehabilitation

Lyall's journey was quite different from Gordon's. At age 50 he was diagnosed with Amyloidosis. This is a condition with similar symptoms to multiple myeloma – cancer of the plasma cells. Lyall had five years of illness before he was able to receive a heart transplant. He also had to undergo a bone marrow transplant.

Gordon and Lyall have experienced a challenging journey with success through grit, determination and expert medical care.

Rotary Club of Peterborough Tag Along Tour – Kanyaka Ruin 20 km north of Hawker

The Rotary Club partnered with Pam and Jim from the Rotary Club of St Peters for an adventure-filled tag-a-long tour that began at Rotary Park Peterborough, then onto Hawker with morning tea.
