

Members minutes - Rod Carey - Shed Re-Opening

After the enforced Covid shut down, the Shed re-opened to the public last Saturday 20th. Although the weather forecast was for 25mm of rain, the first shower held off until closing time and we enjoyed fine but chilly weather.

The first customers were waiting at 7.30 am and from 8 am there was a steady stream until closing time.



Rotarian Sue Bardy greeted all arrivals at the door, signed them in and ensured they disinfected their hands before entry. Due to the relaxing of government regulation to allow 75 customers at a time, overcrowding was not a problem although the most customers present would have been no more than 30 at one time. All customers were happy to follow the rules and social distance.

The number of entries in the book were around 130, but allowing for couples entries, we estimate that perhaps 200 customers attended.

A moderate number of donations of goods were also received.

The counter staff were continually being told "We are so glad you are open again. We miss coming to browse for a bargain and meeting up with friends over breakfast and a coffee." Also, we were often told to Keep the change ".

It is obvious to all workers that the Shed is much more than just an Opp Shop. It is also a meeting place for the locals, particularly those living alone. Linde Reserve has become the "village green" with the Rotary Shed as its focus!

Our neighbour David Harding, who works for Centrelink, confided that the Shed would be even more important after September, when some of the government payments cease. More people will then be in need of our economical goods and clothes, and we will be an important place for social contact and emotional support.

Takings for the day were double the average, and the café sold out of food by noon. We hope next Saturday will be as popular as more people learn that we are open.

A big thanks to all of the workers on the day who all departed feeling weary but rewarded by the public response to their efforts and to those who have put their names down to continue the good work in the weeks ahead.

Thanks also to those who put the time and effort into converting the counters to comply with the safety requirements, and those who gave the Shed a much needed "spring clean" during the shut-down.

With the return of donations, we now need each department to sort and price its stock and get it out onto the shelves to fill the gaps.

Finally, we need even more workers to help spread the load and enjoy the fun and fellowship when you feel safe to join us.
