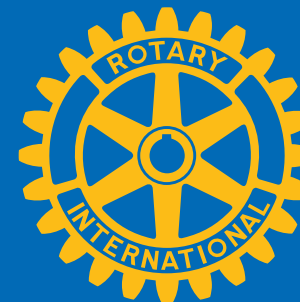

The Rotary Club of Marietta is one of the largest clubs in Georgia where business and community leaders come together to make our community a better place to live and to serve on meaningful projects for worthy local and global causes.

Our History

Founded in 1919 by community and business leaders with the common goal of "Service Above Self," the Rotary Club of Marietta is one of the oldest clubs in Georgia and just celebrated its 95th anniversary.

In Our Community

We are involved with a number of local charities and our members have many different opportunities to make a significant impact on the community through our organized projects.



Some of our recent efforts in the community include:

- In partnership with the Marietta High School Culinary Team, providing monthly dinners for residents of The Extension who are recovering from abuse
- Building, installing and maintaining the Little Free Library System for each of the Marietta City Elementary Schools



- Involvement with Marietta READS! through reading to over 800 children in 39 classrooms each spring and fall
- Renovation of the MUST Ministries Fishes & Loaves, which provides over 40,000 meals each year to those in need
- Cooking and serving of monthly meals at MUST Ministries to provide for those in need
- Renovation of homes for the YWCA to help provide for abused women and children who have suffered from domestic violence
- Providing the garden shed, essential tools, potting station and labor to help Reconnecting Families make the Reconnecting Our Roots Community Garden possible
- Supporting the Marietta Police Athletic League with financial resources and volunteer hours to organize and provide for over 300 children at the annual Children's Holiday Party

In Our Country

Each year the Marietta Rotary Club sponsors an international student to attend a Georgia university as a full-time student as part of the Georgia Rotary Student Program (GRSP). The GRSP scholarship pays for tuition, books, meals and dormitory lodging for one year of study to promote world peace through understanding and cultural immersion.

In our World

Rotarians contribute their time, energy and passion to sustainable, long-term projects in local communities across the globe. Projects focus on important issues like peace and conflict resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy and economic and community development.

Polio Eradication

Rotary is close to eliminating only the second human disease in history after smallpox. Since Rotary International launched PolioPlus in 1985, there has been a 99 percent reduction in polio cases worldwide and polio eradication remains Rotary's top priority. To date, Rotary has contributed more than \$1.2 billion and countless volunteer hours to help immunize more than two billion children against polio in 122 countries. Currently, Rotary is working to raise \$35 million per year through 2018 for polio eradication which will be matched 2 to 1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
