Last week's visit to a Takapuna Club/ alumni event. We were welcomed by the young Takapuna President who told us a little about her Rotary journey. She told us a about Rotary including Polio Plus and her club's involvement with Belmont intermediate, Hospice, the Well Foundation, Vanuatu, Romac and youth. Roz, another Takapuna Rotarian who is nearly 30 told us of her family's involvement with Rotary and how she joined Brown's Bay but when she joined Corrections she changed clubs to Takapuna as the time suited better. Four IYE boys told us where they were from and what they had done in their short time here. They were all looking forward to the South Island trip.

Young Rotarians/Alumni were reminded of their next catch-up. BackYard bar 26 October 6 30pm on.

Julie Chapman co-founder of KidsCan told us about their programs

- shoes for kids-allows participation
- food for kids no lunch means many are kept home
- raincoats for kids
- health for kids .

Many of the families she deals with have at least one working parent and it has been estimated there is a \$7 billion cost to New Zealand for the worst health and education outcomes of the poor. They are now working with more than 600 schools and it is great to see the smile back on these children's faces. \$15 a month child sponsorship helps provide food, shoes, socks and toiletries.

She is hopeful the new government will use the social investment approach in early childhood education. She believes a new approach is needed if we are going to do anything about child poverty.
