Bring your walking shoes to explore the island's network of trails and lookout points, or simply relax with a swim at one of four beautiful beaches. The Rotoroa Island Trust maintains historical buildings and exhibitions showcasing the island's fascinating history and in partnership with Auckland Zoo have released a number of endangered native bird species including takahe, whitehead, saddleback, pateke and kiwi. **Adults - \$52**

Travel the Forgotten World Railway through hidden valleys and tunnels to historic Whangamomona

We start Friday with a leisurely drive to Taumaranui (Car pool?), overnight in Forgotten World Motel. Early Saturday morning departure for 10-hour - 80km RailCart journey thru 20 tunnels to Whangamomona where we stay overnight in famous Whangamomona Hotel. Next morning, transfer by coach back to Taumaranui with afternoon drive back to Auckland.
