30 April Partners' night – quiz – normal partners' meal – cost \$15 and \$35. Pay Bob this week.

Jackie O'Fee and her husband fostered a 12-year-old who is now 18 and attending AUT doing computer science. She lives in Epsom and was surprised that people in her area don't foster. Behind the headlines of funding,' P', babies taken at birth, is a little life. There are 6000 in care 60% of whom are Maori and there are 158,000 notifications to Oranga Tamariki -the Ministry for Children per year. Two foster mums called a meeting and 30 people attended this was the start of Immerse. The Ministry said they needed to become an agency and have a therapeutic model. They found one- TBRI run by Dr Karen Purvis (who has since died). TRBI is Trust Based Relationship Intervention. Two people were invited to Texas for training and with donations they were able to attend. Immerse became New Zealand's newest NGO and their aim is to help young people become great adults. They provide a wraparound service and every person involved has help. They provide emergency care for up to 28



days then full-time transition to permanent care. Who? – anybody. You need to be able to engage and provide hugs and cuddles. A Saturday group therapy is held once a month eventually weekly. Each child has a consistent buddy. It takes time but in their words is really cool. Needed are foster parents, buddies, a social worker and getting the word out in your neighbourhood and workplace. They need money as it costs \$4500 to provide the care. Link mentioned by Jackie-
