RYLA –Bilal Nasier.

Bilal was four years old when he arrived in New Zealand 19 years ago as a refugee. His parents paid a human trafficker to get out of Afghanistan and they spent 3 to 4 months travelling via Indonesia, Singapore, Australia and finally New Zealand. It was a treacherous journey. He took some time to come to terms with how he arrived in New Zealand. He was educated at MAGS and Auckland Uni. While training he volunteered with refugees and now works for the Red Cross as a refugee youth worker and as a behaviour therapist with children on the autism spectrum. He has been with his partner Casey for seven years and owes a lot to her. RYLA was held at Muriwai and they started each morning with drills on the beach. They had sessions on stem poetry, high ropes and five main presenters including Naomi Ballentine and Cam Calkoen. The evenings were spent learning to weave flax and playing cards (with cheese.) The final day two Maori members of the group taught them the Haka on the beach. He summed it up in one word Whakawhanaungatanga- getting to know others, building relationships.

MUNA-Aylana Francis-Durrah

Ailana is a year 12 student at Pinehurst School. Her group of three represented Monaco and as their country is relatively small they tended to agree with what France said. They dressed up in ball gowns on the first day and as yachties the second day. Another Pinehurst team represented North Korea and came dressed as soldiers. They spoke to remits on nuclear weapons reduction to which they were neutral and women's rights where they explained their countries monarchy, sexist attitudes and tax haven status. 80 schools were involved and the lobbying was at times very lively. They joined in the Western Europe block.


Trees For Survival Planting Day with Murrays Bay Primary School
