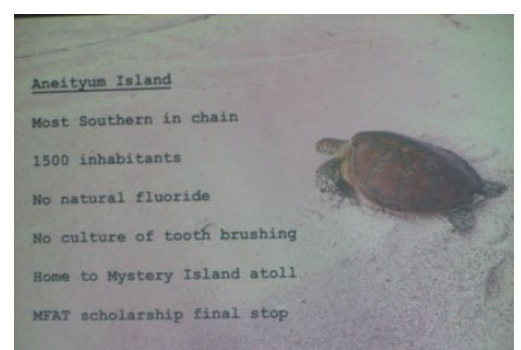

Liz Webb received a rotary grant to go to Vanuatu. She is a dental therapist and has visited Vanuatu 6 times.

Vanuatu has 83 islands and a population of nearly 300,000, a quarter of whom live in Port Vila. She wanted to track the dental health of these vulnerable communities. She found poor oral health and no records so she invited some dentists to help. She visited Aneityum Island which had the worst oral health. She soon realised that she had to train people to do some of the easier jobs. An electrician who travelled with her to manage the donated equipment was also able to fix local solar equipment and a fridge. Through a donation solar powered electric toothbrushes are being trialed. Donations of spectacles and guitar strings would be very much appreciated.
