So far I have been in Norway 7 months, it has helped me to develop as a person. I have gained so much confidence in myself as a person and my level of independence has grown tremendously however my Norwegian is progressing rather slowly in the right direction. I recently travelled to Germany with another Rotary exchange student to visit one of the previous students who was staying in Norway during the first 6 months of my exchange, I have also had a tour through Norway with the other exchange students staying in Norway. We visited the cities of Oslo, Bergen Alesund, Trondhiem, Hamer also Lillihamer. This was a great experience but on the second day of the tour I crashed a mountain bike I was riding and was left with a damaged ligament in my left wrist pretty much leaving me house bound for the next 8 weeks a rather uneventful period of time for me. I will be going back to school in 2 days (from when this was written)

I have moved families today which is one of the hardest parts of exchange having to develop a relationship with new people and have to adjust to a new environment. My district conference is in 1 month's time so I am looking forward to that.
