Hamish Coltman is the founder of the Ugandan 'Growth Educational Trust'. In 2015 he left his job and went on a 57 day overland tour from South Africa to Rwanda with a friend. He stopped in the Lake Bunyoni in Uganda. It completely changed his life. He spent a day at Little Angels Nursery and Primary School. He later returned and did 5 months volunteering and has returned many times since then. The school provides education to year 6 and 68% do not get beyond this level. Many of the students travel to school by boat so life jackets were obtained from the Tyndall Family and the Warehouse at cost and DHL provided the transport for free. They have also provided four 5000 L tanks for local villages. They also aim to provide scholarships for students to attend secondary school costing \$1500 to \$2000 per year. Robert who comes from a shack with no water, power or toilet is the first of these. He has to walk twice a day to



fill a 20 L can of water. They hope to do more for both boys and girls as currently many families only send their oldest male for education. Secondary schooling is only provided 30 minutes away in the

main centres. The first four years of secondary schooling lead to trades and years five and six to university. Help can be provided at #240.
