

Ross Buckley with a rapid fire talk and slide presentation gave us a very good appreciation of economics and data today and in the future. KPMG really stands for 'keep playing more golf'. He said there had been a great destruction in trust over the years. Google was trusted more than most experts. Over the last few years there had been great volatility – jet fuel ranging from \$3-\$11. New Zealand is part of the Asia-Pacific region which already has a significant population and rising rapidly. New Zealand figures for over 65-year-old are now 3%, 2020 13%, 2030 34% with 5.5% over the age of 85 by 2051. You can now do business in Estonia while living in New Zealand. It used to take six months to get from design to shop now Zara is doing it in two weeks and if it doesn't sell replace it. The big firms in 2001 like General Electric have now been replaced in 2016 by Amazon, Google, Apple... In New Zealand we now have Zero and Push Pay (1.2billion).

A future of work report replaces what was needed in 2015 with what will be needed in 2020. Replacing quality control and active listening with emotional intelligence and cognitive flexibility and moving critical thinking and creativity to near the top of requirements.

Dollar shave club.com showed a video of a young guy who started with \$5000 and took on the big boys whose business is now worth \$160 million. He met a robot who can work 22 hours a day (two hours for recharging). A significant part of today's management is managing the impact of job cuts. Block chain is now a very important part of the business linking the manufacturer, transporter, wholesaler and seller together. He mentioned the four Qs – digital quotient, intelligence quotient, cultural quotient and emotional quotient. He finished with 10 questions to consider.
