Murray McCully was educated in Dargaville and then studied law at Auckland. He has been the local MP since 1987 and was Minister of Foreign Affairs in the last government.

He thanked Rotary for their humanitarian efforts especially in the Pacific. His first majority was 311 but with changing demographics the present majority is now 16,000. He was a member of the committee bringing in MMP but voted against the legislation. The Gulf States are the gateway to Africa and the Middle East. 60% of the worlds arable land is in Africa but the Gulf States have no water and no arable land. He made it a personal issue to be more involved in the Pacific. Getting a seat on the



United Nations Security Council was a challenge as we were competing with Spain and Turkey. Hard work in the right places resulted in three quarters of the votes in the first ballot were for New Zealand. Being chair for two months was demanding especially negotiating with the five superpowers who have veto rights. He started in Cabinet as Minister of Customs and was 25th out of 25. He worked for five leaders on a strategy committee which meant he knew where the bodies were buried but was often blamed by his colleagues. He started on foreign policy in 2008 was involved with APEC and said our 50% increase in exports to China helped us through the GFC. He urged the Prime Minister to keep the nuclear free legislation but find ways round this to improve our relationship with the US which eventually resulted in two US ships visiting New Zealand.
