Joe Grieg talked to us about Centennial Bush Reserve. Started in 1975 by Prof John Morton and his wife, Joe has been involved since 1991. Centennial park's 28ha is part of the larger 70 ha. golf course complex. The Society exists on money provided by Local Boards and donations. A Small group meets on Wednesday 8.30 to 12 and on the first Saturday of the month from 9 to 12 to weed and clean up. They aim to be predator free and that includes wattles which are pests and they are allowed to remove three pine trees a year. It is hard work and fun but they do need the volunteers and financial support. They are aiming for a clean stream and eventually a track through the golf course and removal of monkey apple trees. They have about 100 members and plant natives when it is the best time.

Kerikeri is very close by and Paihia and Waitangi just 15km way, historic Russell 20km.
