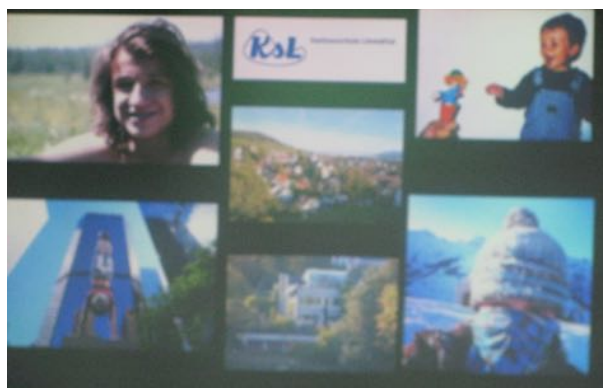
The weekend is to introduce them all to each other, clarify the objectives of the exchange, clarify the rules of the exchange -
