This year marks thirty years of women in Rotary. Districts 9910 and 9920 are organising an informal "Fun Walk" around the Wynyard Quarter and Westhaven area on Saturday morning 6th April. More information to come on that in our next bulletin.

I had a little look at the history behind women being admitted to Rotary, and I have to say that RI did not cover itself in glory, nor look remotely progressive, with their opposition to the idea. The phrase "being dragged kicking and screaming" comes to mind.

It was first mooted in 1950, by Rotary in India, that the word "male" be deleted from the Rotary Club Constitution. This was firmly put down by RI.

In 1977 the Rotary Club of Duarte in California chose to admit women as members in violation of the RI constitution. The club was terminated in 1978 for their efforts! The club fought back, taking RI to court - eventually ending up in the US Supreme Court (because the California Supreme Court refused to hear the case). The US Supreme Court ruled in favour of the Rotary Club of Duarte, which was duly reinstated in 1986.

Finally, in 1989, nearly forty years after India's enlightened suggestion, the Rotary Council of Legislation voted to admit women into Rotary Clubs. Now there are over 200,000 women in Rotary, working very effectively with their male colleagues, to better their local and global communities. It has to be said though, that some clubs in some parts of the world, and indeed some corners of our country are barely through the "kicking and screaming" phase.

And look what they miss out on, women of the calibre of Sandra McKersey, NZ's first District Governor, who spoke to us last night. Sandra is an absolute beacon for all Rotarians, with her energy and vision, compassion and humility, enabling her to achieve some pretty impressive goals to improve the lives of others.

She is also holder of a Queen's Service Medal for services to education and the community.

We learnt about her relationship with the orphanage in Bangladesh. Rotary is involved with lots of different projects and Sandra was part of the team that does audits of the programmes funded by Rotary Foundation. Visiting Philippines, South Africa, Roha, Manila. She can't help herself and gets involved in everything on the way. Organising education, employment, and just looking after people with her big heart.
