

In 2018, RMHC New Zealand provided more than 4,300 families with accommodation and support free of charge at its facilities throughout New Zealand. It was the busiest year since the first New Zealand opening almost 30 years ago.

The Ronald McDonald House® and Ronald McDonald Family Room® programmes take care of the practical things in life so families can focus on their child staying in a hospital away from home.

Glenfield said they had a hands-on project with Ronald McDonald house which involved cooking the meal with provided ingredients by 6 pm. They were cleaned up and gone by 7 pm. It was a very good team building exercise. Monica from our club told everybody about the International Youth Exchange we have had with Cambodia. It arose out of Michelle Parkinson's trips with a Rangitoto students to build houses and

her link with the New Foundation for Children which was then an orphanage. Over three years we hosted three students - Sreychom, Tola and Lily. Each has attended university at night while working during the day. Monday's raffle raised money for another student to come next year.

Takapuna raised a considerable sum for polio plus and are hosting another recycle day with Abilities on 28 March. More information to come.

Derek said Browns Bay Club meet on the first and third Tuesdays at 7 am. With the help of other clubs and trusts they raised \$50,000 to improve a high fluoride water supply in Vanuatu. Their Jumbo Tennis fund raiser is on April 3 and costs \$250 to enter.

Takapuna told us about a Global Grants project that they had with Romac and also a Leeds (UK)



club which with the support of other clubs raised \$141,000 for life saving heart surgery for youngsters from Vanuatu.

Takapuna North told us about Oтуру School which is about 5 km from Kaitaia and has a roll of about 180 of whom 95% are Maori. They have a very switched on Principal, Fraser, who has been able to link in the students with the new open plan school. They have fixed up the swimming pool but the major project is to set up a trust for \$250,000 to send one student away to boarding school each year.
