It will be a big year for me and hopefully the club with some great ideas and excitement in the club that I haven't felt for some years.

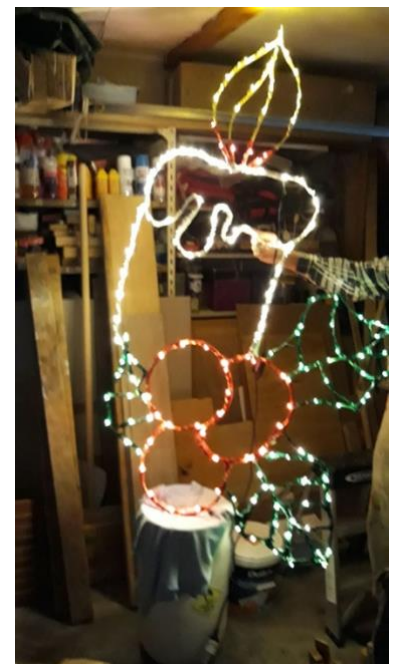
