Therese Leslie decided not to tell us about house sales but instead told us about how small changes can have a big effect. She told us about Eddie who was married with two children when he passed the bar exam to become a lawyer and then on moving to Chicago, became very rich by owning dog tracks and doing business with Al Capone. After some time he realised this was wrong and reported Al Capone to the Inland Revenue Service. Al Capone was convicted of tax evasion and spent 1933-39 in prison. Unfortunately Eddie was shot dead in 1939.

Edward Henry "Butch" O'Hare (March 13, 1914 – November 26, 1943) was an American naval aviator of the United States Navy, who on February 20, 1942, became the Navy's first flying ace when he single-handedly attacked a formation of nine heavy bombers approaching his aircraft carrier. Even though he had a limited amount of ammunition, he managed to shoot down five enemy bombers. On April 21, 1942, he became the first naval recipient of the Medal of Honor in World War II. O'Hare's final action took place on the night of November 26, 1943 when he was shot down. U.S. Navy destroyer USS *O'Hare* (DD-889) and O'Hare International Airport were named in his honour. Butch was Eddie's son.
