**Inter School debate.** The debate was between Pinehurst and Rangitoto with Zach Chambers(photo) as the adjudicator. He is very highly ranked in Auckland and New Zealand debating. After the debate with reference to the moot he explained the scoring system which looked at the mute doing no harm or at least reducing harm and the rebuttal or not of such claims. The moot was "This house would ban the sale of cigarettes". The debaters were all newish debaters from year 10. Affirmative team – Pinehurst –Ruchi Gupta, Jessica Forshaw, Jessica Wang supported by their Teacher Sven Zimmermann. Negative team –Rangitoto -Lucas Heberd and Natalie Tsang supported by their teacher Andrea Meeks. Both teams agreed that banning would not remove cigarettes from New Zealand. It became a matter of balance is to how much addiction could be reduced and the resulting cost savings against the vacuum which might be filled by drugs controlled by gangs and produce more problems.
