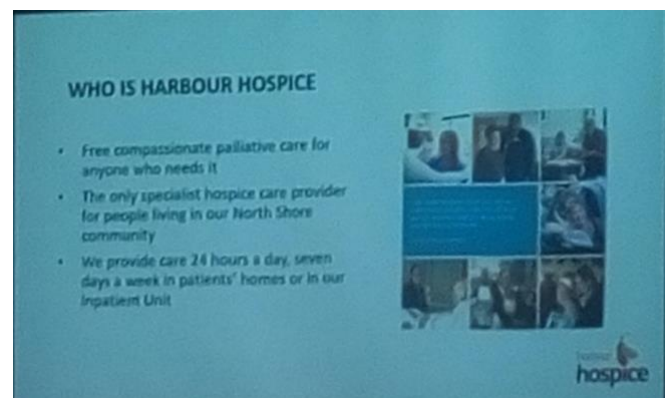


Club Change Over/Mid-Winter Dinner. La Spiaggia. Monday 29 June. 6 for 6.30pm.

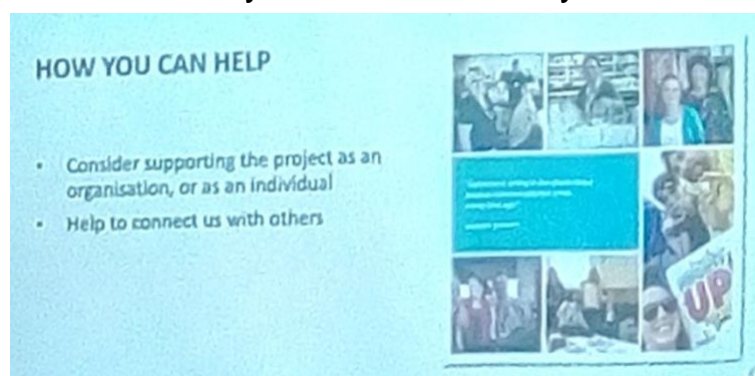
Warwick reported with some sadness that the Inner Wheel Club at Warkworth set up by this club 31 years ago has reluctantly disbanded.

Jan Nicholls CEO of Harbour Hospice was a nurse at St Joseph's/Mercy Hospice and joined North Shore in 2012 becoming Harbour CEO in 2018.

Hospice has 220 full and part time staff and 1400 volunteers mostly in the shops. She thanked the club for their involvement in a previous building project, the coastal challenge and their golf fundraiser. Their area is from Devonport to Te Hana and they are available 24/7. Hospice is a place of safety and shelter. As a result of Covid they lost many volunteers because they were over 70 and they had to shut their shops. Suddenly they had \$64,000 less per month in income. The wage support was helpful. Hospice looks after 380 people but only have 15 beds so most care happens at home. The average time in hospitals is eight days. They expect an increase in palliative care with a growth of 50% by 2035 and 90% in the next 40 years. Unfortunately their current building has leakage issues so they have set up for a rebuild.

Kate the campaign manager then told us that they were trying to raise \$20 million for this building half of which they have from a development fund. \$2.5 million has been raised so far so they are looking for one-off donations/ pledges/ pension

donations/bequests/gifts in kind. They asked for our help in linking them to people to whom a project like this would resonate. Banks are reluctant to lend to charities but they have applied to the government for a 'shovel ready' project.
