Richard Hursthouse is a recently retired local doctor who has been very involved with NS Forest and Bird and Centennial Park. Richard told us about his trip by Russian 'Spy Ship' to the Sub Antarctic Islands. He saw many birds including black shag, royal albatross and petrels. The Snares is not volcanic but very rugged. It has

great foliage and the crested penguin. NZ was once like this. Auckland Islands -Mauka Huka is 51 000 ha7. It was formed by 2 volcanoes and has glacial inlets. The west Coast is very rugged.

Enderby Island has 700 hectares predator free and has sea lions, banded dotterel and another shag as well as rata and stunning vegetation .it has a very good broad walk. The Derry Castle was shipwrecked there in the 1840's as well as the Grafton and the Invercauld in 1984 at opposite ends of the island. Leadership was a key point in the survival rates of the two crews. During the war it was inhabited by Coast Watchers. Macquarie Island (12 000 ha, Australian) is further south but still part of Zealandia It is very isolated, covered in grass, and home to 30 000 Royal Penguins.



Campbell Island was one and a half days sailing away. Another Island is now rat free after a determined effort which has seen the Snipe recover after declining in numbers and reestablishment close by.
