President Sean showed us a video about the 12 North Shore Rotary clubs. Most clubs are mid 30s in size and older so change is needed to adapt to changing times. It is an opportunity for something new without changing our mission, values and ethics. A working group has been set up and there will be a workshop in January. Steve G thanked all those who had helped at the two barbecues. Christmas function please wear party gear and pay online \$30/\$50. 6 for 6.30 at the Brigham. There will be a drink on arrival and wine on the tables.

President Sean opened a special general meeting which confirmed the constitutional changes. He is still looking for a president for next year so there are no nominations so far and also no board.

Sue Stanaway chair of Yes disabilities said they have \$6 million assets in a building a great Board and CEO.

Shore Junction is located in the old Takapuna RSA building and after a \$2.5 million makeover has been set up for young people. It has a 70 seater auditorium for speakers and has spaces for dance, music, a production studio and an art space. It is free for students 13 to 23 and opened in August with a select group of young people. It will be fully open in January and it is hoped the walls will eventually be covered by young people's art and there will be music and innovations aplenty. It costs \$450,000 per year to run and businesses have been very helpful. There are rules- no bullying or discrimination and only 60 people at a time. There is a permanent Director who is a youth worker and it is hoped to have other youth workers maybe some whom are training. It will be open most of the day and has big screens and bean bags to sit on.
