PG Stuart Batty reported to us about the CHEF program in Tanzania. In 1995 Rotary Foundation established a facility for 125 Lepers and their families at Upendo. After visiting the site Stuart and John Somerville returned to New Zealand and asked clubs to sponsor a child for \$250 and many clubs did including this one. ECB sponsored Monica May from 2002-2015. She is now having further education at a boarding school. She has quite good English and thanked the club for their support. In 2005 management of the facility transferred to a Catholic order. They are now self-sufficient in food with crops, cattle (NZ donated) and chickens. Leprosy is on the decline and the new government made education compulsory for all those seven



years and older. This meant an 11 million increase in the school roll resulting in two shifts in many schools. Rotary has started a project to build a new school and have raised nearly half the funds.
