The combined meeting gave us an opportunity to hear from both our respective Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) recipients. This was a very enjoyable evening with good food and good company. Our RYLA candidate, Laura, spoke very well indeed. She recounted how the week was life-changing for many, with some attendees leaving their jobs and pursuing their dreams to build their own businesses. Another shining example of how Rotary helps our local youth and provides high calibre leadership training. Hopefully we'll see Laura again at one of our future Rotary meetings.

On Thursday evening we have a club movie night, with a screening of Viceroy's House at the Bridgeway theatre at 8.00pm This is a fundraiser to support our International Youth Exchange (IYE) programme. Please don't forget to bring your ticket money for Jennifer if you haven't already paid.

If you're reading this week's Bulletin, you probably used a computer to access it. On Friday May 12<sup>th</sup> we saw the emergence of WannaCry ransomware which spread very quickly across the globe, eventually finding its way to computer systems here in New Zealand. It has affected hundreds of thousands of computers and exploited a critical vulnerability in Windows' operating systems. Microsoft actually provided a patch to this vulnerability in March of this year which is a very sobering lesson for those running computers which are not updated on a regular basis. WannaCry searches for and encrypts 176 different file types and appends .WCRY to the end of the file name. It then asks users to pay US\$300 ransom in bitcoins to decrypt the files. Furthermore the ransom note indicates that the payment will be doubled after three days and if payment is not made at all, the encrypted files will be deleted after 7 days. According to US company Symantec, as of 23:00 hrs GMT on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> May, a total of 31.21 bitcoin (US\$53,845) had been paid in 207 separate transactions. They also state that they are not
