Pres Gary showed us some videos about polio in Pakistan which showed it would not take long for the world to have another outbreak if we do not continue to aim for no cases in the world. Railway Station booths in Pakistan can vaccinate 25,000 children per month. In all 2.5 billion children had been vaccinated. Dennis Odbe was a reminder of what can happen. The last video provided some discussion over when the last big outbreak was. (As far as Doug can discover New Zealand schools were closed in December 1947 and until April /Easter of 1948-before his time in New Zealand.)

Jerry Hobson Norman worked for the Ministry of Education and has been a member of North Harbour Rotary since 1989. He has a PHF sapphire pin for services to the community and he has been a rugby and gymnastics coach. Of Maori English and Irish stock he comes from the Spirits Bay area in the North. His European side can be traced back to Governor Hobson.

The first stage of learning is silence, the second is listening... He said the main challenge is to bring people together and to work on Maori employment. We need education and business innovation and more focus on realising potential, collaboration and co-construction. See photos.
