PG Peter inducted Jenna Tuuta into the club. She is from Taranaki and trained in Palmerston North. Jenna taught English in Korea or three years and now is an events organiser for North Shore Hospice. She first learnt about Rotary at RYLA.

PG Peter who is District Foundation Chair addressed us about Foundation. He showed



us a video showing its start in 1917 through to its current size 1 billion US. Highlights included helping disabled children, trying to eradicate polio, the involvement of the Gates foundation, starting international scholarships after the war,

group study exchange and many more. Foundation is the jewel in the Crown and makes a difference. It helps support ERKs and is currently helping to improve the education

status of the 41 million girls with no education. It is also working to improve the life expectancy of under fives and the one in 20 women who die in childbirth. The Gates foundation is currently donating \$35 million a year on a two for one subsidy. Foundation provides funds for district grants and for global grants (over \$30,000 US).

Global Grants

Projects undertaken by D9910 over the past 3 years include:

- Projects undertaken by 55525 deep
 Provide school desks to schools in Vanuatu \$US 59,000
- Renovation to the Nampangasale Junior High School, Tongoa, Vanuatu – \$US 148,000
- Renovation of Godden Memorial Hospital, Ambae, Vanuatu - \$US 151,000
- Equipment for Rehabilitation Center for disabled children in Hongcheon - \$US 43,000
- Dengue Project to control outbreak of Dengue fever in Port Vila, Vanuatu - US\$34,000
- Refurbish the children's ward at the Santo Hospital and provide diabetes training – US\$106,000

He also recommended the Centurion program who donate \$100 per year and benefactors who leave a donation in their will. Donors are recognised by being made a Paul Harris Fellow for donating \$1000 US. Higher awards are given for larger donations.

He asked us to give to our charity – we can make a difference.

The Global Development Tour is a month-long educational trip to Europe and New York starting on January the 11th and ending on February the 7th 2017. The Tour is staffed by 4 volunteer directors, all undertaking tertiary study. The Tour visits cities such as Paris, Geneva, Brussels, Copenhagen and London - all leading examples of the charge to meet the United Nations' Global Sustainable Development Goals. Each stop on the Tour relates to a focus area of these Goals - basic needs, equity and education, environmental sustainability, and business and innovation. In each city we will visit relevant policy makers, businesses and NGOs for educational meetings. The trip then culminates in attendance at the 2017 Winter Youth Assembly – an

international youth conference, hosted at the United Nations
Headquarters in New York
– where we can share what we have learned over the preceding tour with likeminded students from around the globe. I have been fortunate to be chosen as one of 20 high school students nationwide to partake in this opportunity.
