Our guest speakers were PDG Peter and Elaine. Peter told us about their week's tour of South Korea before conference with 26 other Rotarians. They started in Busan where they

visited the UN Memorial Cemetery with a memorial stone from Coromandel. The local fish market was also a highlight. The local District has given considerable sums of money to global grants .In the evening they had a meal at a family restaurant. Andong has been a village for 600 years and is a UNESCO heritage site. It has a very impressive mask museum. PyeongChang will host the 2018 Winter Olympics and they saw the ski jump and also some world-class ceramics. The District is a generous donator to ROMAC. While there PDG Peter accepted an award on behalf of the Whangaparaoa Club.

Elaine told us about the Seoul Convention with a theme "touch the world". There was an app for the convention with 45,000 delegates and eight languages available via headphone.
