Morgan's message.

There is no meeting of the Club on Monday as it is Queen's Birthday weekend. Monday also happens to be Arbour day here in NZ, so you'll have plenty of time to get out and plant a tree (or two)!

This club has a strong history of planting trees, as we have been long supporters of the Trees for Survival project and, in particular, having supported the growing unit at Murrays Bay Primary school. In fact we have been supporting this unit for the past 22 years over which time it would have produced and planted many thousands of trees. The teachers also tell us that the students involved gain a great deal from the experience of growing and then planting their trees (with our assistance) and helping the environment.

The Trees for Survival (TFS) programme is an environmental education programme which involves young people growing and planting native trees. This is done in partnership with organisations such as Rotary, with the aim to restore natural habitats by helping landowners revegetate erosion prone land, improve stream flow and water quality and increase biodiversity. Currently there are over 5,000 schools involved and over 70,000 trees planted each year. Over the past 20 years TFS would have planted more than 1 million trees!
