The District Youth Committee are organising three separate Seminar evenings for all those with an interest or responsibility for any Youth based programmes and events across District 9920.

This is a MUST attend for all those listed above. However if someone is unable to meet the date for which their club is assigned they will be encouraged to attend another location on one of the alternative dates. If you don't have a Youth Director, Nominate one or two people into the role to ensure your club is informed and able to participate in Youth Programmes across our district.

The Seminars will be run in three separate locations;

Papakura; for clubs in **South Auckland** from Otahuhu to Tuakau : 12th July *Papakura RSA*

Auckland Central; for all the City based clubs : 19th July *Remuera Golf Club*

Auckland East; for all the Eastern Clubs from Pakuranga to Howick: 26th July *TBC*

The Seminars will cover information on all the district supported programmes as well as detailed discussion on the responsibilities and risks facing clubs in any and all their interactions with youth (under 18) based programmes. Other Club specific programmes will also be highlighted.

There will be presentations on how to engage with Secondary School Groups, the introduction and ongoing management of Interact Clubs and the promotion of District Youth Programmes.

Attendees will be provided with guidelines on Police Vetting, how to operate within the Rotary agreed Youth parameters and how to deal with issues and incidents, plus the activation of the "Youth Activity Wellbeing Policy".

There will be advice on the costs of each programme and budgeting and, how funding support can be achieved from either other clubs or Charitable Trusts.

There will be time for questions and discussion and attendees will be able to build collaborative relationships with other clubs to assist where required.

Members of the District Youth Committee plus Assistant Governors will be present to discuss the programmes.

An Invitation will be circulated to your clubs in the next few days. Please respond to that with your RSVP asap. Any Questions call me on the number below.

Donating to Charitable Causes - Important Note: —

It is very important that all Club members when giving funds for a particular Charitable purpose, make out the payment to the "Rotary Club of Botany East Tamaki Charitable Trust Account".

Acc # 123233-0450671-00

Also note the payment to nominate the Charity or purpose the funds are for, if it is for a specific Charity.

Failure to make these payments to the Clubs Charitable Trust Account, will invalidate any receipt for IRD and Charities Commission purposes.

If members personally make out a donation/ contribution directly to the Charity, or the Charities Bank account, it will not be able to be claimed as a Charitable Donation, **unless** the recipient is a registered Charity and issues you with an appropriately identified Receipt.

The Club will consolidate the moneys for the specific Charity and forward a single payment from our **Charitable Trust Account** directly to the respective Charity. The recipient will then be able to Claim the money as received from a Registered Charity for IRD purposes.

The Club "Charitable Trust Account" will also make out an IRD acceptable Receipt

- There are more than 1.2 Million Rotarians all over the world in more than 33,000 Rotary Clubs in more than 200 countries in all geographic areas.
- The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships is the world's largest, privately funded scholarship program.
- Providing vitamin A supplements during polio National Immunization Days has averted an estimated 1.5 million childhood deaths since 1998 – testimony to the "plus" in PolioPlus.
- The first service project of the first Rotary club of Chicago was installation of public toilets in the city.
- The first Rotaract Club was formed in Charlotte, North Carolina, USA.
- The first women joined Rotary in 1987. Today, more than 196,000 woman are members of Rotary International.
- Rotarians in the United States make up 28% of all Rotarians worldwide
- Nauru and formerly known as Pleasant Island, is an island country in Micronesia in the South Pacific. Its nearest neighbor is Banaba Island in Kiribati, 182 miles to the east. It has the least amount of any Rotarians in the world, numbering only 11.
