Trust News

Pukekohe Community Action (PCA) is the recipient of a \$5000 donation to assist with Food Parcels. Due to the lockdown and risks associated with leaving our bubbles, many in our community are not working or can't leave their home to shop for food.

PCA has been working in concert with the local Salvation Army Chapter (who only operate limited days) to distribute food parcels. We must also acknowledge the local supermarkets who are also assisting.



Cyclone Harold hit the islands pretty hard and Rotary has responded with an issue of our world class Emergency Response Kits (ERK's). These provide basic equipment and necessities to get families re-started overt the first 72 hours following a disaster.

But with massive crop destruction, food is becoming a problem. Fiji local Rotarian **Bob Niranjan** has underwritten an urgent purchase for food parcels and has asked NZ Rotary Clubs to assist. Our Trust once again is stepping up and donating \$500. To leverage this, **Alan Eyes** suggested that if 10 Rotarians could donate the \$25 they would have spent on meals this month, then we could double this to \$1000. Details on the Trust bank account to make this donation will be sent soon.

Rotary Youth Exchange Inbounds - Locked Down but not Out

Going into a four-week lock-down due to a world pandemic is not something any of us would ever have imagined doing, least of all our group of seven Inbound RYE students. But heck are we proud of the way these young ambassadors have conducted themselves during this challenging time.

D9920 is currently hosting seven delightful young ambassadors, two from France and one each from the Netherlands, Denmark, Chile, Austria and Germany. Weighting up the pros and cons of "should I stay, or should I do?" and in constant consultation with their families and Rotary advisors here and at home, our Awesome Inbounds have all elected (for now) to stay here.

The RYE D9920 Committee have been working hard in the wings to ensure all seven of our Inbound RYE students have clear communication on the continually changing situation and are safe. But we would like to extend profuse thanks to all our Inbound hosting Rotary Clubs: Pakurunga, Papakura, Waiheke Island, Tuakau, Pukekohe, Newmarket and Drury. Each of these clubs has reiterated their commitment to supporting their student and ensured all current host families are happy to continue hosting, despite these very unusual circumstances. Rotary at its very best, in action, right here in our District!

To their credit, our Inbounds have remained incredibly positive about the complete change to their everyday "norm". They are currently keeping on their toes with twice-weekly Zoom meetings combining connection, fun and a bit of Rotary-refinement as they take turns to deliver their Presentations, for practise and peer critique.

They can present their PowerPoint presentations showing where they are from and are always keen to share their experience on exchange so far, answers questions and chat!

Cyclone Harold cause significant devastation in the Pacific including remote areas of Fiji. Rotary Clubs in Fiji 15 April handed over F\$280,000 worth of assistance for the people of Fiji residing in the Western and Central Divisions who had their houses destroyed during Tropical Cyclone Harold. The provision of the ERKs on Monday and todays handover bring Rotary's assistance towards TC Harold to over F\$0.5 million.

This is a coordinated response led by Rotarians in Fiji, working closely with RNZWCS, NDMO New Zealand Government's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) through its High Commission in Suva and Aquabox Australia.

Rotary Fiji have provided the following items today:

- · 216 Rotary Emergency Response Kits (ERK's) to the Commissioner Western's Office in Lautoka for damages in the Yasawa Group of islands, Malolo Island and rest of the Western division. We await breakdown for our audit purposes.
- 63 more Rotary Emergency Response Kits (ERK's) to the NDMO Office in Suva for use in the Central division. Of the 73 ERK's provided on Monday 13th April, 62 were sent to Vatulele and Beqa today. This 63 will be transported from Commissioner Western's yard to Suva on Saturday (as per our telephone discussion



- · 110 Aquabox 'Family' (these are very similar to ERKs packed and distributed by Aquabox Australia, a project of the Rotary Club of Eltham in Victoria, Australia. These have been handed over to NDMO Office in Suva. A list of contents is attached. We await breakdown of distribution for our audit purposes.
- 12 Aquabox '30' containing water purification aid items, each box capable of supporting 150 people for 110 days. These also have been handed over to NDMO Office in Suva. A list of contents is attached. We await breakdown of distribution for our audit purposes

RNZWCS co-ordinator Stuart Batty and District 9920 Governor Gary Langford based in New Zealand are in regular communication with Rotary Fiji for reports on damage, needs assessment to be able to provide humanitarian assistance required following TC Harold.

Rotary Fiji and RNZWCS based in Christchurch, have been providing humanitarian assistance to communities in Fiji over the last 15 years.

Partnership will infuse an additional US\$450 million into global polio eradication effort

EVANSTON, II. (January 22, 2020) – Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation are renewing their longstanding partnership to end polio, announcing a joint commitment of up to \$450 million to support the global polio eradication effort.

"Because of the efforts of Rotary and its partners, almost 19 million people are walking today who would have otherwise been paralyzed," said John Germ, Past President of Rotary International who leads Rotary's polio fundraising efforts. "By partnering with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, we're ensuring that children in polio-affected countries get the lifesaving vaccines they need to be protected from polio for life. As the first organization to envision a polio-free world, Rotary is more committed than ever to delivering on our promise that one day, no child will ever again be paralyzed by polio."

To an audience of Rotary volunteer leaders from around the world, Bill Gates, co-chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation delivered a video message announcing the extension of a funding partnership forged more than a decade ago. Rotary is committed to raising \$50 million per year over the next three years, with every dollar to be matched with two additional dollars from the Gates Foundation. This expanded agreement will translate into up to \$450 million for polio eradication activities.

"The Gates Foundation's longstanding partnership with Rotary has been vital to fighting polio," said Mr. Gates in today's message to Rotary volunteers. "That's why we're extending our funding match, so every dollar that Rotary raises is met with two more. I believe that together, we can make eradication a reality."
