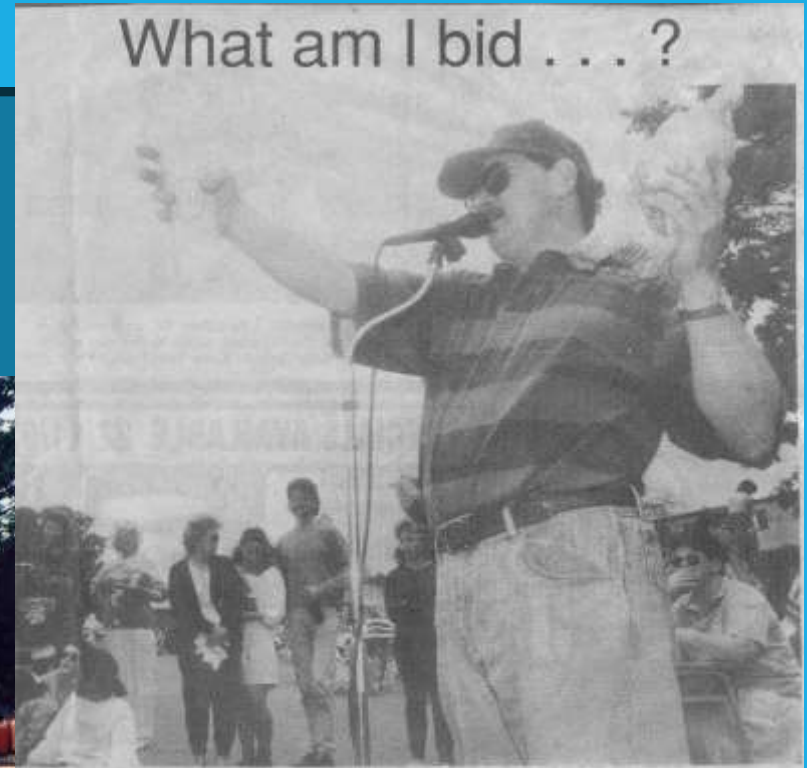

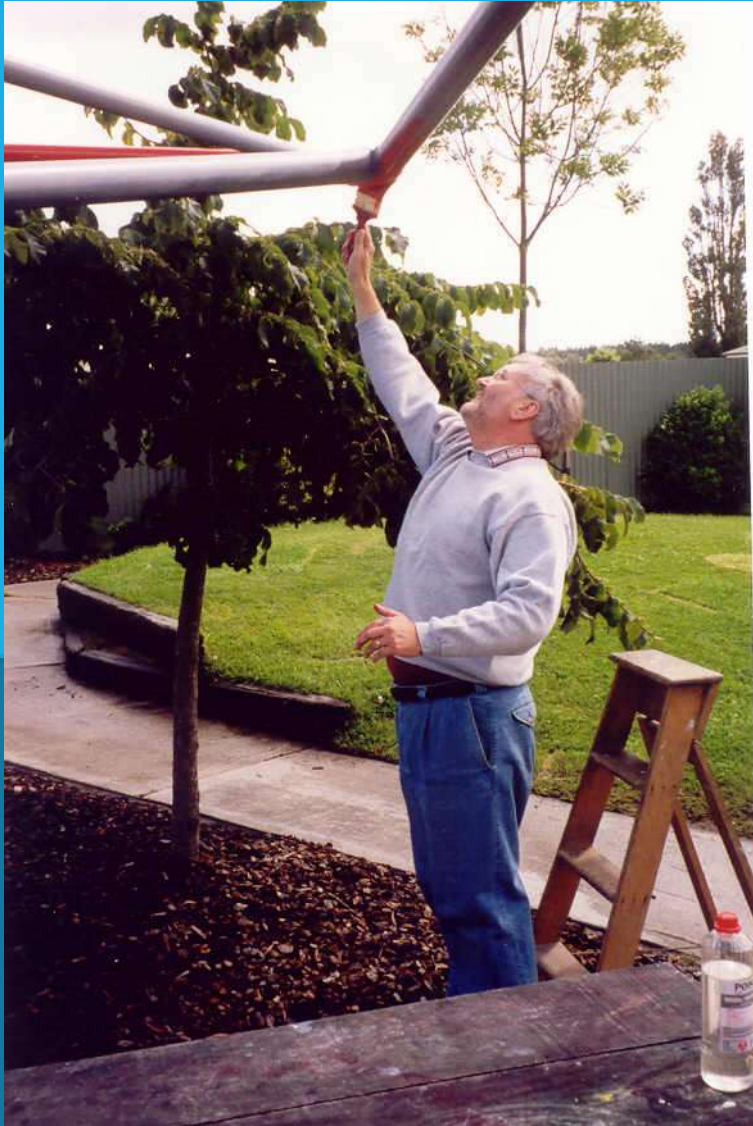

Hagley Park Helipad



Easier ambulance access to helipad

Ambulances will now have easier access to helicopters bringing patients to Christchurch Hospital.

An access way and turn around area has been constructed next to the Hagley Park helipad with the help of a \$4000 donation from the Sunrise Rotary Club.

Canterbury Health has also upgraded the helipad.

Rotary president Barry Swaney said because it met weekly at the nearby Trustbank Netball Centre, the club became aware of the increasing number of emergency and medical transfer flights, and the need for quick access by ambulance vehicles.

they prepared to do their duty.

Mostly old railwaymen well down the track to retirement, impeccably attired in black suits and ties and peaked railway hats, they would stand imperiously in the middle of the road and raise their Stop sign, like latter-day Messiahs commanding the ocean to be still. And the traffic would come to rest.

Each crossing keeper had a hut where he could brew cups of tea to warm his hands and the cockles of his heart. The last such hut to see active

service in New Zealand was at Sockburn. It was also one of the most ornate huts in the country.

When the railway overbridge was built at Sockburn in 1959, it rendered the keeper redundant. His hut became obsolete. This hut had served a double purpose up to the 1950s. The Sockburn tramline had terminated in a loop by the Racecourse Hotel and the crossing keeper had operated a switch lever in the hut to change the tracks as required.

The hut had stood beside the old road, which can be seen snaking off the present road to the left, facing south, then curving sharp right under the overbridge towards Racecourse Road.

It stood there unused for another 10 years, becoming the target of vandals and the victim of weather, until the Jaycees stepped in.

Summer Wine leader Don Hampton

says the sight of the forlorn hut last year convinced the six mates to have a go at a restoration job. For months they met each Tuesday at Ferrymead, armed with hammers, saws, and beer. Each appointed day, they set to work at the crack of noon. At 4pm, they knocked off and, weary and blistered, cracked their cold cans in warm camaraderie.

With timber donated by Knightleys and building expenses covered by the Rotary club of Christchurch Sunrise, Ferrymead, and Avonhead, the team completed the task in March. A crane then lifted the hut onto a trailer and it was moved a few metres to its new resting place.

It may be its final resting place. It is almost certainly the end of the line for an institution that has not been seen in Christchurch for half a century. But it is only a refreshment stop for the Last of the Summer Wine.

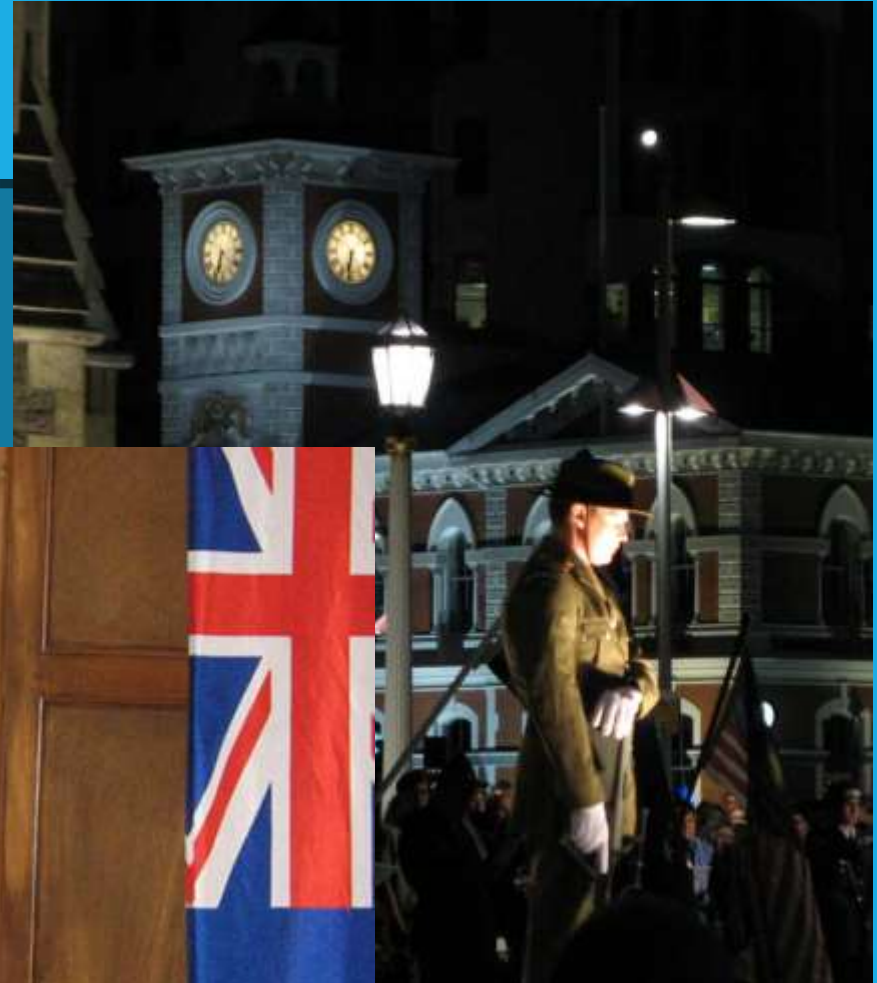

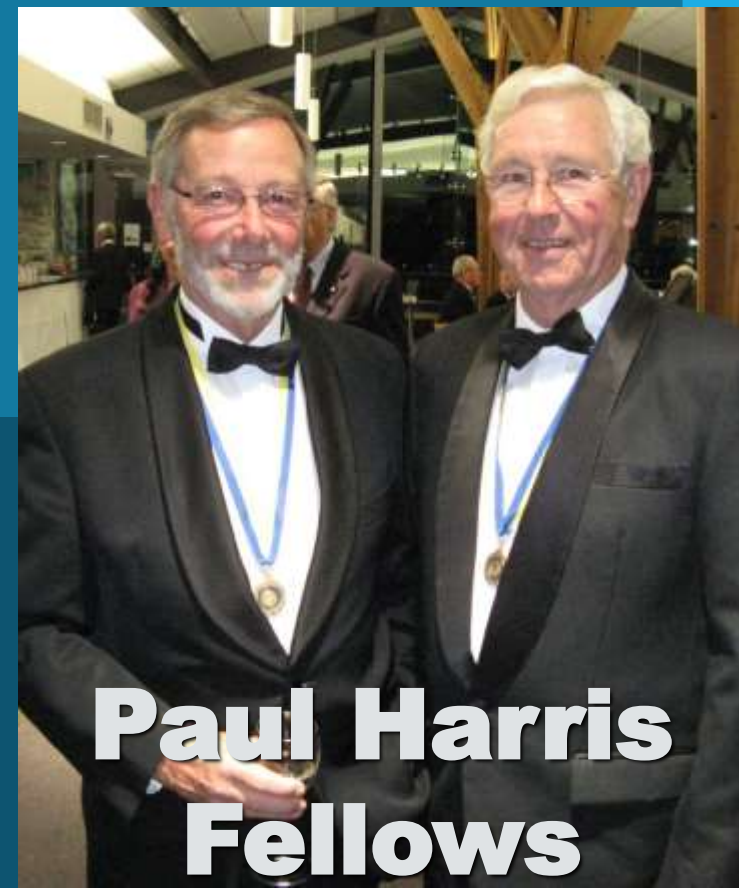

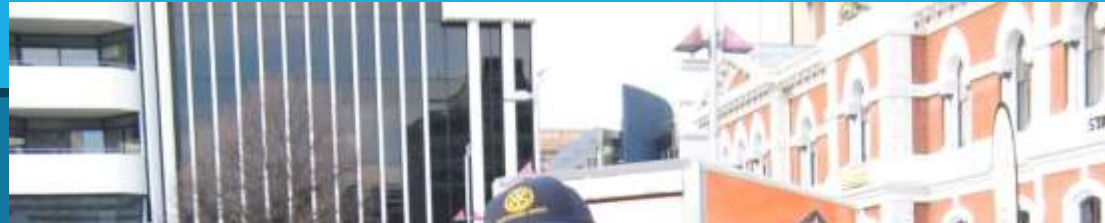
