President of the Law Commission.

The end of Lockdown Zoom was celebrated with  
two speakers, David Bennett and David Moore.

David Bennett referred to the increase in  
Foodbank customers, many of them first timers  
who had lost their jobs and were having  
difficulty with applications for WINZ assistance.  
Supplies for food parcels were dependant on  
food rescue charities such as KCA and Kaibosh.

David Moore spoke of his role as an intellectual  
property lawyer and the effects of working from  
home during lockdown along with his wife, a  
speech therapist and a 10-year old child. This  
sometimes meant getting out and exploring their  
home suburb of Johnsonville. He went on to  
speak about some of the global companies he  
represented. Last, but not least, was his  
membership of a Celtic band, whose music can  
often be heard wafting over Ngaio.

## KIWI COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE

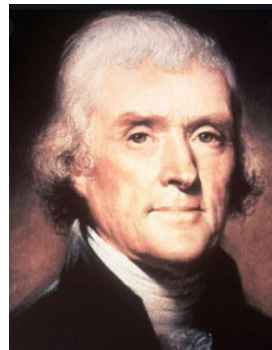
KCA is a distribution hub to 72 local foodbanks, schools and community organisations. Last financial year it rescued and redistributed nearly 200 tons of food and nearly 3,500 banana boxes full of clothing, schools supplies to its partner agencies. All stock is distributed to our partner agencies with whom it has a service contract to assist their clients. KCA currently has 1 paid staff member – Michele, the General Manager and 92 volunteers.

With the growing size of the operation, KCA is consolidating activities and moving on 10/12 July to a larger warehouse in the same industrial complex.

Some assistance with the move will be sought from Club members in July.
