CHANGEOVER GUEST SPEAKER TIM McIVOR



Tim McIvor first came to New Zealand from Northern Ireland on a Commonwealth Scholarship to complete a PhD on the life of New Zealand's Irish-born Premier John Ballance. This work was published in 1989 under the title of "The Rainmaker". At Auckland University Tim met his wife Paula, which happily resulted in his staying on in New Zealand and joining the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. As a diplomat he served in Moscow, Manila and New York before being appointed as Ambassador to Timor Leste. In 2012 Tim became head of the Visits and Ceremonial Office, which

manages visits to New Zealand by heads of government and other dignitaries. Now retired from the public service, but working hard on his golf game and first novel, Tim will bring his Irish wit to bear on the subject of "How to Distinguish a Visitor".
