
### Who is in Wellington Regional Children's Hospital Region?

A demographic with a population of about 900,000.





# **Architectural Designs**







### Financial Breakdown - \$105 million

- \$50 million commitment by Mr Mark Dunajtschik to build and donate a new Wellington Regional Children's Hospital.
- \$28 million Govt and CCDHB contribution
- \$21 million Government funding to enable the demolition to assist with all site testing and preparation, drainage and demolition of three buildings to make way for the new 7,500m2, 3 story, stand-alone Children's Hospital.
- \$6 million Wellington Hospitals Foundation and community for the latest equipment and fit-out to ensure the new Children's Hospital will not only be the best structurally built hospital but the best equipped hospital in the Southern Hemisphere.




Mark is funding the building to completion stage. The Foundation will be seeking up to \$6million to complete to project. Our goal is to have everything as "All Brand New"

- Announcement was 10 July 2017
- Building Site was been identified
- Plans are 90% finalised
- Build started early 2019
- Hospital will be a separate building
- Opening March 2021

### Over the past 12 months there were:

- 6,845 sick children admitted to the Wards
- 34,478 visits to "Paediatric Outpatients"
- 10,607 visits to the Emergency Department
- 3,518 babies born
- 785 neonatal babies (from the region)
- 11,610 x-rays of young people
- 7,000 Paediatric Orthopaedic patients
- 1,326 children seen by the Child Development Service
- 2,343 audiology visits
- 1,817 operations performed on sick children
- 3,198 visits to the Eye Clinic
- 1,588 cardiology patients

# Funding of non-medical items will include:


- Technology based initiatives

- An education and research centre
- Staff and administration areas
- Patient and family friendly areas




