# The Numbers 2018

- 22 ethnicities and 35 schools represented on the programme
- 92 applicants for 40 places
- 48% increase in application from 2017
- 97% said IYM increased their interest in pursuing a STEM career
- 93% want to keep involved in IYM
- 97% satisfied with the programme

## Numbers continued

- 22 volunteers contributed
- 19 Rotary Clubs involved
- 75 % would have not been able to attend without the Rotary sponsorship
