You can join Karori Rotary as a full member or support and participate in the activities of the Club as an Associate Member.

Full membership provides all the rights and privileges of being a Rotarian at Club, District and International level. Full membership currently costs \$230 p.a. A monthly venue charge of \$15 also applies.

A meal charge of \$23 is made for meetings which includes dinner.
