□ Increase our impact

□ Expand our reach

□ Enhance participant engagement

□ Increase our ability to adapt

Our discussion considered opportunities in Tawa that apply these priorities. For example:

brings together employers, volunteers, award recipients; using publicity and communication channels to extend our reach; sharing recipients' stories that inspire

other people

□ Concert in the Park – Tawa Rotary being visible in our community; enabling people to

connect, and have a sense of belonging in the community.

 Heartbeat CPR – Tawa Rotary together with Wellington Free Ambulance – providing

access to this up to date knowledge that can save lives; and encouraging local

community groups and families to attend the WFA free training sessions.

□ Assessing community needs – Pat's letters to many key contacts are seeking

responses on needs in Tawa that we can facilitate, support and ensure what we do is relevant.
