

Budgets for 2024/25

1. Details were sought as to a line of expenditure showing "other expenses" of \$5,276 for the current financial year, and a budget of \$5,000 for next financial year.

These are the expenses associated with activities such as Pride in Work, Concert in the Park, Foster Hope. Of relevance, there are some related income elements shown under "Other Income". At year end these elements are matched and reported on separately.


2. Rationale for budgeting \$10,000 for fundraising income for 2024/25 Club Treasurer responds as follows:
